Who can take part in the research?



You can take part in the research if you

• Are 18 years old or over



Have an intellectual disability



• Live in Australia



 Have experience with teaching students about intellectual disability or an interest in teaching



• Can use Zoom to be part of the study

What does taking part involve?



We will ask you some questions by email or phone to check if you can take part in the study.

We will not keep any information about you if you cannot take part.



You will be part of an online focus group if you can take part.

There will be about 4 other people with intellectual disability in the focus group.



You can choose to do an online interview instead if

- The focus group times do not suit you
- You prefer not to share your ideas with other group members



You can also choose to have a support person with you in the focus group or interview.



The online focus group will be on Zoom.



We will ask you about

 How you would like to be involved in teaching health students about intellectual disability



What support you would need to be involved in teaching



You can choose which questions to answer.

You can say no if you do not want to answer a question.



We will ask to video record what you say.



If you are doing an interview you can ask us to take notes if you do not want us to record what you say.



If you are doing a focus group we will have to video record the meeting.

You can turn your camera off if you do not want us to record your face.



The focus group or interview will take about 1 ½ hours.



You will get a \$150 Coles or Coles-Myer gift card to say thank you.

Do I have to take part?



You only have to take part if you want to.

You can say no.



It is your choice.

No one will be angry if you say no.



Even if you say yes you can change your mind later and stop taking part.

What will happen to my information?



We will store your information and recordings on our computers.



The computers have a password.

Only we will know the password.



We will store your information and records for 5 years after we write reports about it.

We will keep your information private.

We will not tell anybody your name or where you live.

No one will know it was you who took part.



We will write about what we find out.

If you want we will send you a summary.
