
People with intellectual disabilities are a significant minority group who experience a disproportionately high burden of disease, illness and poor health outcomes. Compared to the general population, people with intellectual disabilities experience a reduced life expectancy of up to 20 years, higher rates of multiple health conditions, and up to three times the prevalence of mental disorders.

The RANZCP has long advocated for better recognition, services and funding for people with an intellectual disability. A more inclusive approach is needed at a policy and planning level in order to ensure the unmet mental and general health needs of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Australia are addressed.

Despite the high specific health care needs of people with an intellectual disability, most medical students graduate with limited understanding of the issues. This project's aim of determining the nature of current intellectual disability health content, and identifying quality educational resources is timely and vital to build the capacity of the medical workforce to meet the complex health care needs of this population.
